#### Sing, Perform, Inspire

On Friday, 16th March, Year 2 took part in a "Sing, Perform, Inspire" workshop led by Chiltern Music Academy. The aim of these workshops is to inspire children to reach a high standard of performance in less than 3 hours, and to raise their confidence and self-esteem as they perform a short video recorded concert to Headteachers and Governors.

220 children from six different schools came together for the morning and responded brilliantly to the leadership and teaching of Mrs Venvell and Mrs Marsh. The children (and staff!) learnt three songs and were able to perform them with style, focus, passion and musicality. The audience of Headteachers and Governors were extremely impressed, and all the children should be congratulated on their fine performance. We look forward to hearing and seeing our Year 2 children perform to this standard in future school assemblies and events!

All the children were given three leaflets to bring home so that you, their parents, can see what CMA offers every week. #### SAVE THE ALBATROSS STAMP APPEAL

"Since Christmas, I have been collecting used postage stamps. I read about the RSPB's stamp appeal to help save the albatross and I wanted to help out. The albatross is the largest seabird in the world. There are over 22 different species and 17 of them are endangered.

The RSPB is collecting used postage stamps to raise money to help albatrosses. The stamps will be sold to raise money to help rescue these birds. There are lots of reasons why the albatross needs help. One is that they get caught on fishing lines. The other is that they are eating plastic that is in the oceans. The money will go towards paying for new special fishing nets, hooks and teaching fishermen to use them. I now have over 18,000 stamps but I would like to collect a lot more. Each stamp only raises a small amount so we need to collect as many as possible. Remember, the more stamps the more birds we save.

#### **Morning Drop off**

We would like to thank you for encouraging your children to come into school independently. This ensures that they make it in on time and do not miss any of their learning.

We will still continue our staff presence outside to aid the children safely into school and this will also give you the opportunity to relay any concerns with our Senior Leader, Linda O'Malley who is our lead on pastoral care who can pass onto the Class Teachers on your behalf. Alternatively, if you would like to speak to the class teacher, you could send a note in or see them after school between 3:30-3:45 as part of our open door policy.

## Quackers

If you have any wraparound care needs, or if your child is just looking for something fun to do, Quackers can provide childcare before and after school. Please ensure you have completed their booking form prior to turning up, which can be found on their website.

## **Breakfast Club**

Upon arrival, the children will be offered Breakfast consisting of a choice of cereal, along with toast with various toppings, yogurt and fruit. Should your child have a favourite cereal that they do not stock please let them know and they will do their best to cater for them (please note that they are a nut free club so there may be certain cereals they cannot provide).

## After School Club

Once all children have arrived and the register has been taken, they all go outside and play until 4.30PM. This allows children to get some fresh air and give them the opportunity for physical activity such as football, skipping, rounders etc. There are also areas where the children can just sit and talk outside should they be tired after their day at School.

If your child is staying past 4.30PM, they will be provided with a snack. Their snack normally consists of a choice of two of the following foods being Rolls, Sandwiches, Wraps and Cracker Bread. For fillings, there is always a choice of Ham slices, Chicken slices, Cheese, Quorn, Marmite, Jam and Honey. With every tea two varieties of Vegetables and two varieties of Fruit are offered.
