Dropping off children

We are extremely lucky to have use of our turning circle. Please be reminded not to block it at morning drop off, despite this being on various Dojo posts, this still remains an issue. <u>Parents are not allowed to park in the staff</u> <u>overflow carpark</u> at any time as this prevents staff from parking and delays their start to the day which in turn, affects children's learning.



All children arriving after the gates have closed, will need to be signed in at the school office on our Inventry system by the adult bringing them to school.

Similarly, we have received some comments from local residents who have been affected by inconsiderate parking which is disappointing to hear. Please be respectful when parking to ensure pavements and driveways remain clear at all times.

Collecting children

At the end of the school day, the priority of the teacher/support staff is ensuring that all children are collected safely and effectively. If you have a query/question, please wait until all children have left, or alternatively, send a message via dojo and the teacher can respond accordingly. <u>Kids Lunch</u>

Kids Lunch are excited to announce the new ordering system which has been upgraded to make the process smoother and more user-friendly!

With the new system, you will now be able to:

- ${\mathscr O}$ Create an account to manage orders easily
- ${\mathscr O}$ Modify or cancel orders as needed
- ${\mathscr A}$ Apply meal credits (paid lunches) toward future meals
- ${\mathscr A}$ Avoid past-date orders with an integrated calendar
- ${\mathscr O}$ Ensure orders meet the midday cut-off for the following week

<u>Please remember to order your child's meals by 12PM on the Friday cut-off to ensure meals are provided.</u> If you miss the cut-off, packed lunches will have to be provided for the whole week.

These updates will resolve previous syncing issues and provide a more seamless experience for you and our team. We appreciate your patience and feedback as we continue to improve our services. Please can we ask parents not to bring their dogs onto the school site at any point. Not everyone is comfortable around animals and both adults and children can find them intimidating.


Instead, please wait by the school sign or tie your dog to the railing by the sign, away from the gate, before coming onto site. Thank you for your support with this.

GIFT BACK PROJECT

A parent is excited to share an incredible opportunity for the children and families at the school, to get involved in a heartfelt initiative: The gift back project. This is an initiative that teaches children about the importance of empathy and kindness by helping children in need around the world. Through this project, we aim to raise awareness about less fortunate children who have experienced unimaginable hardship, and empower the students to make a meaningful difference.

Here's how it works: children will fill a sturdy tin or shoe box with small toys and thoughtful gifts for children for their chosen age and gender. This is an opportunity for them to show generosity and compassion, creating a tangible impact on the lives of others. Once filled, the boxes will be collected at the school, and the gifts will be sent to children who truly need them. The campaign will culminate in May 2025, and the gift boxes will be shipped off in June.

We are excited to invite you and your children to be a part of this meaningful and powerful initiative, helping to bring joy to children who need it most. Thanks to the support of caring families like yours, over 35,000 gifts have already been delivered to children in Yemen, Syria, and the UK. Now, it's our turn to make a difference!

Taking part is simple: repurpose any empty date or biscuit tin (or a sturdy box like a shoebox) and fill it with thoughtful gifts. Items can include small toys, colouring books, colouring pens, and more! Then, just label the box with the gender and age group you have chosen. These boxes will then be shipped to children who have tragically lost their families due to conflict and hardship.

The children who will receive these gifts are between the ages of 0-11 and are living in orphanages, having faced devastating loss, homelessness, and hunger. Many have lost everything, and we can be the ones to bring them a little happiness and hope.

Once your box is packed, drop it off at the Hughenden Primary School office by **Friday, May 2nd.** A volunteer will then collect the boxes, and ensure they make it to children in need.

If you are unable to prepare a gift box, don't worry! You can still contribute by making a donation at the link below. Your donation will go towards purchasing gifts for children, ensuring that even more children receive a gift and feel the love we are sending.

Suggested Items to Include (all new):

- Small toys, stationery, arts & crafts, crayons, colouring books
- Hygiene items (e.g., sanitary towels, new T-shirts, socks, underwear, flip-flops)
- Accessories like hairbands, hairbrushes, yo-yos, puzzles, balls, jewellery
- Age-appropriate books, notebooks, and even clothing like dresses or hijabs

Please do not include:

- Food, liquids, sharp objects, fragile items, or war-related toys (e.g., guns, knives)
- Any used or damaged items, medicines, or sweets
- Suggested Age Groups:
- 0 to 3 years
- 4 to 8 years
- 9+ years (Please label boxes for girls with sanitary items as 'Girl 9+')
