Weekly Home Learning

- Listen to your child read daily. Two books are sent home each Wednesday (to be returned Wednesdays to school). Please aim to read the Phonics book 2-3 times and record this in their reading record. The other book is for pleasure and you can read it together with as much support as needed.
- Read to your child a range of text types, over a week, for 15 minutes every day.
- Support your children to complete One Minute Maths homework online.
- Encourage children to learn and use their weekly spellings.

<u>Enrich Activities-</u> Things you can do at home to Enrich your child's learning. This will help to empower your child in the classroom and help ignite their curiosity.

English:
