Dear Parents,

As we find ourselves well into the Spring term, it's hard to believe how quickly time has flown since we

returned in January. The start of term may feel like a distant memory, but it has been great to see many opportunities of engaging learning experiences for our pupils. One particular highlight was our whole-school exploration of Peter Reynolds' book, 'The Dot'. It was truly heartening to see every single pupil throw themselves wholeheartedly into the tasks set. Their enthusiasm and creativity shone through, resulting in an impressive showcase of work in the school library area.

On a more serious note, I need to address some concerns regarding parking and waiting arrangements around the school. We've received several messages from worried parents about the use of the turning circle at the front of the school during drop-off and pick-up times. To clarify, this area is not for waiting. If you're using the blue railings area, it should be for a quick 'kiss and drop' only. We also kindly ask that you refrain from parking in front of staff cars. To ease congestion, we encourage 'park and stride' from The Harrow pub or nearby streets. We are also aware of recent issues with vehicles parked at the entrance to Spring Valley Drive and have alerted the local police. We have also requested further visits from our local PCSO during busier periods. Finally, if you have been issued with a Parking Permit, please ensure your engine is turned off whilst you are parked on site and refrain from staying any longer than necessary to free the space up.

The pupils are always keen to start their learning day. Moving forwards, we ask that parents say their goodbyes before the blue gate, allowing children to walk in independently. If you need to pass a message to a teacher, please do so via myself, another the staff member at the gate, or through email or Class Dojo. The start of the day is a crucial settling-in time for pupils and relaying messages to the class teacher at this time is not suitable.



Mr Wyatt has started a lunchtime Chess Club for Years 3 & 4 on a Wednesday and Year 5 &6 on a Thursday; both sessions have been well attended – thank you Mr Wyatt!

And finally, we have received the news that we have been

Dropping off children

We are extremely lucky to have use of our turning circle. Please be reminded not to block it at morning drop off. Unattended vehicles and parking spaces being blocked whilst dropping children off is having a knock-on effect with your child's learning schedule as staff cannot access spaces to park.

Collecting children

At the end of the school day, the priority of the teacher/support staff is ensuring that all children are collected safely and effectively. If you have a query/question, please wait until all children have left, or alternatively, send a message via dojo and the teacher can respond accordingly. We respect the work life balance of our staff so please be patient in awaiting a response.



End of school day

Please be reminded that the school day ends at 3.10pm for KS1 (not including Hoppers), and 3.20pm for KS2. We have a small number who are consistently late and it is unfair on staff who sit there and wait. If you cannot collect at the relevant times without any reasonable explanation, children will need to be booked in to our wraparound care provider, Friends at Play, assuming they have spaces.

Kids Lunch

Kids lunch are in the process of redeveloping the website to enable parents to create an account whereby they can access their orders, make changes, cancel meals & obtain credits for cancelled meals. The new system will also link to a calendar so that the ordering process is much more efficient. They aim to have the new system up & running around February half term and we will keep you posted on this as we receive updates from them.



Please remember to order your child's meals by 12PM on the Friday cut-off to

ensure meals are provided. If you miss the cut-off, packed lunches will have to be provided for the whole week.

Please can we ask parents not to bring their dogs onto the school site at any point. Not everyone is comfortable around animals and both adults and children can find them intimidating.

Instead, please wait by the school sign or tie your dog to the railing by the sign, away from the gate, before coming onto site.


