How to help at home:

Reading:

One of the most important things you can do with your child at home is read. By the end of Reception most children are able to read and understand simple sentences. This supports children with more independent work in Year 1.

Please read a variety of books to your children and as the year progresses please encourage them

to join in!

Writing:

Activities such as playing with playdough, colouring and threading are great for developing finger strength and control.

Recipe for playdough:

2 cups of plain flour

1 cup of salt

1 tablespoon of oil

Slowly adding cold water until texture is correct.

Paint/food colouring for colour!

Getting your child to help will really enhance the fine motor skills! Building on those muscles to help their writing skills.

Maths:

Numbers are all around us, so it is easy to incorporate number recognition and counting into daily life: try going on a number hunt, counting how many Lego bricks are in a tower and playing board

games
