It was lovely joining together last week to celebrate Harvest Festival; all the pupils sang beautifully and those who had speaking parts, read clearly for all to hear. Donations for the One Can Trust will remain open until Friday – thank you for those who have donated.

As you are aware, we are working collaboratively with the SENDCO team from Great Kingshill School both working remotely and on-site. The role of the SENDCO is to work alongside the class teachers to ensure appropriate provision is in place to ensure all children learn. Over the next few weeks, if your child has SEND needs, we will be contacting you to see if you need any further guidance or if you have any questions or queries about the provision for your child. In the meantime, if you need support before this then please contact your class teacher or myself, either face-to face or via Class Dojo or email.

Mrs Messenger is running the Phonic workshop in school on Wednesday evening from 5:30pm – this is suitable for parents of children in Foundation and Year 1. Out first 'Coffee and Chat' is taking place on Thursday morning; all are welcome including younger siblings.

Attendance

Why is it important for children not to miss school? We know that as parents, you want the best for your child and for them to get on well in life. Having a good education is important to ensure that they have the best opportunities in their adult life. They only get one chance at school, and your child's future may be affected by not attending school regularly.

If they do not attend school regularly they may:

• Struggle to keep up with school work. In a busy school day, it is difficult for schools to find the extra time to help a child catch up.

Setting good attendance patterns from an early age, from nursery through primary school, will also help your child later on in their life. Children who have a poor school attendance record may have less chance of securing a job when they are adults.

• Miss out on the social side of school life. Poor attendance can affect children's ability to make and keep friendships; a vital part of growing up.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week = 80% attendance = more than half a term missed per year.


An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.

Punctuality is just as important. Make every minute count!

Being late for school reduces learning time. If your child is 5 minutes late every day they will miss three days of learning each year. If your child is 15 minutes late every day they will miss 2 weeks of learning each year.

Why is punctuality so important?

Being on time is vital. Arriving late at school can be very disruptive for your child, their teacher and the other children in the class. It is important that children understand the importance of time keeping and being organised. There may be times when you are finding it difficult to ensure that your child attends school regularly. If this is the case, it is important to talk to us as soon as possible.



The One Can Trust

The One Can Trust held an assembly in school on the 18th September as part of our Harvest Festival celebrations.

As part of our Harvest Festival we are accepting donations on behalf of the One Can Trust. The One Can Trust Foodbank helps local people, giving out food aid to adults and children across High Wycombe and South Bucks.

Permission to walk home

If you have given permission for your KS2 child to walk home please note this does not apply to the after-school clubs. We will need parents to email to give consent as there is no crossing patroller with night's drawing in and getting darker earlier.

Collection times and arrangements

We wanted to email with an important message about informing school of changes to collection arrangements to ensure we receive your message in time and to give you the reassurance it's been received and communicated to class.

For any change to collections, please ensure you email <u>office@hughendenprimary.co.uk</u> before 2.30pm. Any notifications after this point, must be followed up with a phone call to the school office.

We have noticed a handful of children who are consistently late in being collected, sometimes as long as 30-40 minutes which is impacting on staff. We are monitoring this and will speak to the individuals should it continue. We fully appreciate the local roadworks aren't helping this situation and also understand that emergencies arise sometimes with no prior warning. It maybe you are doing a secondary school run first and collecting from Hughenden last.

However, this can't continue and we would ask, where ever possible, to make arrangements for a friend or family member to collect your child/ren on your behalf if you can't get here on time, putting a password in place for adults we haven't met before. If this isn't possible, consider booking into ASC making sure you have registered ahead of time. The online booking facility will quickly advise you if there are spaces available. Here is a reminder of the collection times which we ask you to respect.

Hoppers preschool: 3.15pm

Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6: 3.20pm

Parent Pay, School Grid and Hot School Meals



<u>Hot lunches</u> - for all payments related to hot lunches, please log in to your Schoolgrid account. Alternatively, you can call Dolce Customer Services to make a payment over the phone – the number to call is 01942 707709.

<u>School Trips</u> - for school trips over the value of £10, we offer parents the facility to pay online using Parent Pay. The reason for this is because we get charged a transaction fee per item and it needs to remain cost effective for us.

School Immunisation Update July 2023

MMR (Measles, Mumps & Rubella) & Pre-School Booster

You may be aware that we have had several cases of measles in Bucks over the past few weeks. Cases of measles continue to rise across England in those that are not fully vaccinated. All three diseases can be very serious and are highly infectious.

Please ensure your child has received 2 doses of the Combined MMRR vaccine since their first birthday. The vaccine is routinely given at 1 year and approximately 3 years 4 months in the UK, usually at the same time as their pre-school booster. This information can be found in your child's Red Book or from your GP.

If you believe your child still requires their MIMR and/or pra-school booster vaccination, please either contact your GP or the School immunisation Team to make an appointment for vaccination.

Long hair should be tied back neatly away from the face. No extreme hairstyles or hair gel is permitted. Any hair accessories should be in school colours. Nail varnish is not permitted.

Jewellery The only jewellery which may be worn to school is:

- A watch
- Plain round ear-studs (gold/silver or clear) if a child has pierced ears (one set only).
- Religious jewellery e.g. cross on a plain chain (tucked inside the shirt) or a Kara (Sikh) bangle.

For safety reasons, jewellery is to either be removed or covered (masking tape/ sweatband) during PE
