Dear Parents,

It has been lovely to welcome back the pupils following the February half term break. Last week, I accompanied Year 5 on their residential to Woodrow High House; everyone had an amazing time and we enjoyed a range of activities; my favourite was seeing everyone climb the totem pole to leap off and when they all moved through a muddy trail while blindfolded. The centre staff were extremely complementary of how well behaviour the pupils were and their exceptional manors – well done Year 5!

As we move through the Spring term, we continue to have a number of different events across the school. This include World Book Day on Thursday, Year 2's trip to Cadbury World, Red Nose Day on Friday 21st March and the Year 6 residential to Norfolk Lakes. I will be accompanying Year 6 on their residential to Norfolk Lakes and I am very much looking forward to the adventure packed week where activities will be including kayaking, high ropes and caving. While I am away, if you have any questions or queries, then in the first instance, speak to the office staff or Mrs Messenger, and if needed, they will contact me.

We are aware that Ramadan has begun, and understand that this is an extremely important time for our Muslim families. We understand that when children reach puberty they are expected to fast, this is usually around the age of 13 - 14 years old (children under the age of puberty are not expected to fast). However, we also understand that some wish to start earlier than this. To ensure that our children continue to learn to the best of their ability, the school requires that every pupil participates in the curriculum. At lunchtime, Miss Shabbir from 12-12:30pm has begun a small reflection group for those who are fasting and then from 12:30-1pm, the pupils go outside.

If your child is fasting, we kindly ask them to bring in a snack and some water in case they feel unwell during the day. Children who fast will be monitored during their lessons and parents will be called if any child shows signs of being unwell. For families fasting during the holy month of Ramadan I would like to wish you all Ramadan Mubarak.

Nut Free School

Please note we are a **<u>nut free school</u>**. Please refrain from sending in any food, sandwich filling or nuts of any kind in children's lunch boxes. We have children in school with severe/life threatening allergies which puts them at risk. Thank you for your support with this.



We do ask parents to consider the nutritional value of the food they

include. Nutritionists recommend that a child's lunchbox should include on portion of each of the following:

- Fruit or vegetables, cut up for younger children to prevent choking
- Milk or dairy item
- Meat, Fish or other protein source
- Starchy food such as bread, rice or pasta
- Consider limiting treats such as crisps, chocolate, cakes, etc, to one item a day.

Allergies seem to be on the increase and over the last five years we have always had at least one child with an allergy to nuts or some other type of food. To combat this, we educate the children about diversity and have a no swapping or sharing of food from lunch boxes rule in place.

We really appreciate your help in educating the children in the importance of a healthy lifestyle of which a healthy and balanced diet is crucial.

Dropping off children

We are extremely lucky to have use of our turning circle. Please be reminded not to block it at morning drop off. Unattended vehicles and parking spaces being blocked whilst dropping children off is having a knock-on effect with your child's learning schedule as staff cannot access spaces to park and start their working day.

Similarly, we have received some comments from local residents who have been affected by inconsiderate parking which is disappointing to hear. Please be respectful when parking to ensure pavements and driveways remain clear at all times.

Collecting children

At the end of the school day, the priority of the teacher/support staff is ensuring that all children are collected safely and effectively. If you have a query/question, please wait until all children have left, or alternatively, send a message via dojo and the teacher can respond accordingly. We respect the work life balance of our staff so please be patient in awaiting a response.



End of school day

Please be reminded that the school day ends at 3.10pm for KS1 (not including Hoppers), and 3.20pm for KS2. We have a small number who are consistently late and it is unfair on staff who sit there and wait. If you cannot collect at the relevant times without any reasonable explanation, children will need to be booked in to our wraparound care provider, Friends at Play, assuming they have spaces.

<u>Kids Lunch</u>

Kids Lunch are in the process of redeveloping the website to enable parents to create an account whereby they can access their orders, make changes, cancel meals & obtain credits for cancelled meals. The new system will also link to a calendar so that the ordering process is much more efficient and user friendly. The website remains exactly the same in its initial appearance and the address is the same, it's just the mechanics behind this that will change. Parents can continue to place their orders as usual. Once the new system is



working, they will be able to create an account for their children and place their orders as usual, the way this part looks will be different, but it will be very intuitive and user friendly.

<u>Please remember to order your child's meals by 12PM on the Friday cut-off to ensure meals are provided.</u> If you miss the cut-off, packed lunches will have to be provided for the whole week.

We have been informed by Kids Lunch that, regrettably, they have had to increase their prices for KS2 lunches which will become effective from the 1st April 2025. This hasn't been an easy decision for them to make but given the rising costs of ingredients and supplies, it's unavoidable. KS2 meals will now cost £3.00.

Please can we ask parents not to bring their dogs onto the school site at any point. Not everyone is comfortable around animals and both adults and children can find them intimidating.

Instead, please wait by the school sign or tie your dog to the railing by the sign, away from the gate, before coming onto site. Thank you for your support with this.

They will be using a booking system called iPAL which will streamline their approach providing a smoother and more inclusive service for parents.


The new system will come into effect from 1st April, however parents are able to go on the system now to get setup and have a look around.
