Why do we have a uniform?

School uniforms:

- provide a strong sense of “identity” and belonging
- reduce peer pressure at school for the latest clothes and reduce the risk of visible inequality
- help children feel settled and prepared for school
- are helpful in fostering a good learning environment
- help promote the ethos of a school,
- help children’s personal and character development and the promotion of our CHEER values
- assist with safeguarding, especially outside on trips and visits

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

Our school’s legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The Equality Act 2010 prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include age, sex, disability, race, religion or belief, pregnancy and maternity, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils
- Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)
- Allow all pupils to style their hair in a way that is appropriate for school and makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons or if they are experiencing discomfort related to their sex, gender or gender reassignment
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and/or other religious garments
- Allow pupils with sensory or physical needs to make reasonable adaptations to their uniform depending on their specific needs
- Allow for reasonable adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents to get in touch with the Headteacher, Mrs Katherine Mann, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests. These will be considered on a case-by-case basis

School Uniform

Our uniform supplier is Ultimate Incentives, based locally in Great Kingshill, Bucks. Our school uniform has been chosen for comfort and practicality.

White or pale blue polo shirt
Preschool logo cardigan or sweatshirt
Preschool logo book bag

Hughenden Primary School

KS1 (Foundation - Year 2)

Pale blue polo shirt
School logo sweatshirt or cardigan
Grey skirt, pinafore dress or smart grey trousers or shorts
Checked blue/white dresses during the Summer Term - optional
White or navy socks, grey or black tights
Headscarves can be worn for religious reasons in plain blue or grey.

Whilst it is desirable for children to wear the logo uniform, we accept this may not be affordable to all our families. As such, children can wear a plain navy sweatshirt or cardigan which is available widely.

KS2 (Years 3-6)

White shirt (long or short sleeved)
School tie
Navy blue v-neck jumper with the school logo
Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
White, grey, navy or black socks
Blue/white checked dress in the Summer
Headscarves can be worn for religious reasons in plain blue or grey.

All Children: these items are essential please

Sensible shoes – black
Wellington boots
Trainers or plimsolls and socks
Named drawstring PE Bag
Navy tracksuit, top and bottoms, navy shorts, white t-shirt, PE socks
School book bag with logo (for preschool, Foundation and KS1 only)
Drinking bottle for water and lunchbox for KS2 Children if not taking a hot lunch

ALL ITEMS MUST BE LABELLED AND NAMED PLEASE

Long hair should be tied back neatly away from the face. No extreme hairstyles or hair gel is permitted. Any hair accessories should be in school colours. Nail varnish is not permitted.

Jewellery The only jewellery which may be worn to school is:

- A watch
- Plain round ear-studs (gold/silver or clear) if a child has pierced ears (one set only).
- Religious jewellery e.g. cross on a plain chain (tucked inside the shirt)

For safety reasons, jewellery is to either be removed or covered (masking tape/ sweatband) during PE
