Spring Valley Drive junction

The supervisor from Buckinghamshire council has provided us with 2 additional signs at the junction of Spring Valley Drive. Whilst on a visit to see Mario, our school crossing patroller, the supervisor observed several parents using their mobile phones whilst turning into the school junction, as well as children not seated correctly in the moving vehicles. This included lack of seatbelts and/or car seats. This is such a worrying sight. The crossing patrol is in operation every day before school and also after school. When approaching the school and when turning right out of Spring Valley Drive onto Valley Road, please do have an awareness of Mario, parents and children. With the low sun this time of year, please take extra precaution to ensure the roads are clear before manoeuvring.









Be Bright Be Seen!



During Autumn and Winter the days are getting shorter, morning and evening are darker. Mist and fog have an impact on visibility, so it is harder for drivers to see pedestrians walking near the road.

It is important to wear reflective and fluorescent clothes when we are walking, cycling or scooting to and from school, to stay safe and to be seen by the drivers.

Stay safe near the roads:

- Always remember to stop, look, listen and think before crossing the road.
- Traffic can be fast and dangerous so we should always take care near the road.
- We can help keep ourselves safe by wearing reflective or bright clothes, wearing bike helmets when we cycle and wearing seatbelts in the car.

Fluorescent fabrics work well during daylight and the hours of dusk but won't show up in the dark so it's important to also look for reflective fabrics and consider adding reflective tape to bags and clothes to ensure you can be seen in the dark by car headlights.

Anyone cycling during winter months should ensure bike lights are clean and in good working order. It is important to remember, it is against the law to cycle at night without a white front light, a red back light and a red reflector at the back of your bike.

Message from Thames Valley Police

Dear resident,

you may know someone who has an e-scooter at the top of their wish list this Christmas 🔏

Whilst many retailers are now advising the law around e-scooters at the time of buying, we also want to make sure that you know the laws before committing to a big purchase \mathbb{Z}_{+}

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the Road Traffic Act 1988, which means you need to have a licence and insurance to ride one in public.

It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters. This means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as parks, street pavements, and shopping centres.

If you use a privately-owned e-scooter in public, you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for having no insurance.


There will be a Children's book stall at the Winter Wonderland event. We will be asking for donations of used/good condition children's books for stall.
